Book Week: 3rd - 7th March 2025





This year, we have chosen the author Roald Dahl to be the focus of our book week. Throughout the week, the children will be given opportunities to participate in a variety of crosscurricular activities linked to a particular Roald Dahl book.

Our aims for book week:

- To develop a love of books, reading and listening to stories.
- To create a reading community across the school and develop relationships.
- To immerse pupils in creative ideas related to books, engaging children and their parents in reading for pleasure.

What's happening in school?

Monday 3rd March – Today, we will launch book week and you will find out which Roald Dahl book your teacher has chosen. All week, you will be completing English and cross-curricular activities linked to your class book. **Drop Everything And Read (D.E.A.R.)** will take place outside today.

Tuesday 4th March – Today it is Book Swap day which will take place in the library at lunchtime. Please bring a book (in good condition) that can be swapped for another. (Remember, you will need a book to swap to be allowed entry. You get to keep the new book you choose but you will give away your old book and won't get it back.) Please bring a cuddly toy which you can read to when we D.E.A.R. today.

Wednesday 5th March - D.E.A.R. will take place in our school teams today. Please bring your extreme reading challenge photograph to school. Each class will also be voting for an animation of one of Roald Dahl's books they would like to watch on Friday.

Thursday 6th March – It's World Book Day! Please dress up as your favourite book character or a Roald Dahl character. Please remember to also bring the book your character is from to read during D.E.A.R.. We'll have a parade so we can see all the different characters you have come as. We are also having a cake / biscuit competition. Bake Roald Dahl inspired cakes, cupcakes or biscuits and these will go on sale after school today.

Friday 8th March – Today, we will find out which animation received the most votes and we will watch the winning choice in the afternoon. D.E.A.R. will take place when parents visit this afternoon so you can share a book together. (Parents, please bring a favourite book from home or you can choose one from school.) More details and timings to follow. Make sure you've brought your designs for a new book cover into school.

Home Reading Challenges / Competitions



- Design a new front cover for any Roald Dahl book. Winning entries will receive a £10 book token.
- Enjoy reading a book in an extreme place, ask an adult to take a photo and bring it to school on Wednesday 5th March.
- Create a collage / painting / drawing of your favourite Roald Dahl character.

We'd also love to hear about any books that have sparked your imagination. Use My Blue Peter to apply online.

To earn this badge, you must:

- Be aged between 5-15 years old.
- Apply for your Book badge online using My Blue Peter.
- Ask your parent or guardian for permission to apply and ask them to <u>read</u> the Privacy Notice.
- Get your parent or guardian to help you fill out your form and personal details.
- Tell us about a book you have read and what you think about it. Maybe you liked the characters, or perhaps you enjoyed going on exciting adventures in faraway places.
- Upload your illustration of a character or a scene from the story. This could be a drawing, painting or even digital artwork.
- Let us know what other books and authors you have enjoyed reading and why.
